ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of Burien from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the City. We also determined whether the City complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Accounting/financial reporting
- Open public meeting minutes
- Open public records laws compliance

• Use of restricted funds

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the City's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The City also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE CITY

The City of Burien serves approximately 47,700 residents within King County. The City provides residents the following services either directly or through contracts with other governmental agencies and outside vendors: Municipal Court, parks and recreation, planning and community development, police and fire, public facilities and utilities.

An elected, seven-member Council governs the City. The Council elects one member to serve as Mayor to preside over the Council for a two-year term. The Council appoints a Manager to oversee the City's daily operations as well as its 68 full-time employees. In fiscal year 2012, the City's general fund operating budget was \$20.5 million.
