ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Ridgefield School District No. 122 from September 1, 2010 through August 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Payroll and benefit disbursements
- Accounts payable disbursements
- Procurement of public works and architectural and engineering services
- Student enrollment reporting
- Associated Student Body activities
- Compliance with bond covenants

RESULTS

In most areas, the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

However, we noted certain matters that we communicated to District management. We appreciate the District's commitment to resolving those matters.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Ridgefield School District No. 122, located in Clark County, serves approximately 2,100 students from kindergarten through 12th grade. The District operates a high school, middle school and two elementary schools. An elected five-member Board of Directors governs the District. For fiscal years 2011, 2012 and 2013, the District operated on annual operating budgets of \$16.8 million, \$17.5 million and \$18.2 million, respectively, and has 171 employees.

AUDIT HISTORY

We perform a financial and federal grant compliance audit of the District annually and perform an accountability audit every three years. The past five audits of the District have reported two areas of concern. The 2008 audit contained a fraud investigation report relating to payroll, which has since been resolved. The 2012 audit reported an internal control finding involving federal grant compliance. We are issuing a similar finding in the current 2013 audit.



ABOUT THE STATE AUDITOR'S OFFICE
