#### ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Toppenish School District No. 202 from September 1, 2011 through August 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Open Public Meetings Act
- Disbursements
- Credit card usage
- Travel
- Bid law

- Cash receipting high school, middle school and elementary school
- Enrollment
- Staff mix
- Transportation

#### RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

#### ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Toppenish School District No. 202 provides educational services to approximately 3,600 students in kindergarten through 12th grade in Yakima County. Services include a full range of school programs including basic elementary, middle school, high school, vocational education, alternative schools, bilingual education, pupil transportation, food services, special education and numerous special programs for remedial and enriched education.

The District is governed by an elected, five-member Board of Directors. The Board appoints a Superintendent to oversee the District's daily operations as well as its 450 employees. For 2012 and 2013, the District had annual operating budgets of approximately \$40 million.
