Audit Summary

City of Deer Park Spokane County June 24, 2014

ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of Deer Park from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the City. We also determined whether the City complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Procurement (purchases)
- Safeguarding of assets (fuel usage)
- Contracts/agreements

- Inter-fund transactions/balances
- Use of restricted funds

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the City's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The City also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE CITY

The City of Deer Park, incorporated in 1908, serves more than 3,000 Spokane County residents. It provides an array of services including water and sewer utilities, streets, parks and recreation, traffic engineering, planning, economic development and general administration. The City contracts with Spokane County for police and court services. The City is also served by Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 4 and the Spokane County Library District.

An elected, five-member Council and a separately elected Mayor govern the City. The Council appoints management to oversee the City's daily operations as well as its 10 full-time and several part-time, seasonal employees. For fiscal year 2013, the City operated on an annual budget of approximately \$8.3 million.
