ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Everett Public Facilities District from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Safeguarding of small and attractive assets such as computers
- Sponsorship agreements
- Debt/covenants

- Conflict of interest
- Third-party cash receipting
- Financial condition

RESULTS

In most areas, the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

The Everett Public Facilities District was created on April 10, 2001. The District oversees operations at the Everett Events Center. The Everett City Council approved an inter-local agreement among the city of Everett, the District, Snohomish County and Snohomish County Public Facilities District concerning participation in and financial commitments to the Center.

The District is governed by an appointed, five-member Board of Directors. A third-party management company, responsible to the Board of Directors through a contract, manages District operations. The District has no employees. Operating income, user fees and collection of sales tax rebates are the primary funding sources for the District. For fiscal year 2013, the District had operating revenue of \$8,093,443.
