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## AUDIT SUMMARY

### Results in brief

In the areas we audited, City operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The City also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

### About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of Renton from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the City's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Citizen hotline
- Credit cards and accounts
- Police/Sheriff Department
- Courts
- Golf course cash receipting
- Community center cash receipting

Our opinion on the City's financial statements and compliance with federal grant program requirements is provided in a separate report, which includes the City's financial statements.

### **Federal grant programs**

We evaluated internal controls and tested compliance with the federal program requirements, as applicable, for the City's major federal programs, which are listed in the Federal Summary section of the financial statement and single audit report.

## INFORMATION ABOUT THE CITY

The City of Renton was incorporated in 1901. It is located on the southern shore of Lake Washington, next to the cities of Tukwila and Kent, and serves approximately 95,000 residents. It operates under the mayor-council form of government and has an independently elected Mayor and seven elected Council Members. The City provides a full range of municipal services including police, court and fire. It operates enterprise funds for water and sewer services and a surface water utility. The City provides library, parks and recreation, and planning and community development services. It also operates its own airport and golf course.

The City's 2013 general fund operating budget, which provides for the majority of general governmental services, was just under \$100 million. The City's ending 2013 net position for its governmental and business-type activities combined totaled approximately \$790 million.
