We are pleased to present the results of our accountability audit. The attached report is a public record and will be posted to our website, www.sao.wa.gov.

We want to emphasize that if conditions change, an onsite audit may be required in future years. For example, if the District spends \$500,000 or more in federal funds in any one year, federal rules require the District to receive a financial statement and single audit for that year. Also, if annual revenue is expected to consistently exceed \$300,000, an onsite audit could be performed based on a pre-determined schedule. If you have exceeded or anticipate exceeding these thresholds, we ask that you contact our Office so we can help you meet your audit requirements.

## **Audit Summary**

### Strathview Water District No. 16 Spokane County August 19, 2014

#### ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Strathview Water District No. 16 from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2013.

The objective of our audit was to evaluate the adequacy of the District's internal controls to safeguard public resources and the District's compliance with state law and its own policies. In keeping with general auditing practices, we did not review every aspect of the District's internal controls and compliance. Instead, our review focused on areas representing the highest risk of misappropriation, misuse or noncompliance.

Our report is addressed to the governing body and management of the District. However, this report is a matter of public record and its distribution is not limited.

#### RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and its own policies in the areas we examined.

Strathview Water District No. 16, located near Medical Lake, provides water services to approximately 100 customers. The District has one employee. An elected, three-member Board of Commissioners governs the District. The District operates on an annual budget of approximately \$70,000.
