### **AUDIT SUMMARY**

#### Results in brief

In the areas we audited, Port operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The Port also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

#### About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Port of Walla Walla from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Port's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Leases
- Airport fuel
- Bond compliance
- Procurement/small works roster

- Vendor payments
- Credit cards
- Self-insurance

### INFORMATION ABOUT THE PORT

The Port of Walla Walla was formed by voters in 1952 and has bonding authority and taxing powers. In 1989, the Port assumed ownership of the Walla Walla Regional Airport and in 1996 became the lead economic development agency in Walla Walla County. The Port is organized to operate an airport and provide services related to leasing industrial properties and farmland.

An elected, three-member Board of Commissioners governs the Port. Commissioners serve staggered, six year terms. The Board appoints management to oversee the Port's daily operations as well as its 20 full- and part-time employees. For fiscal year 2015, the Port received approximately \$8.3 million in revenue and had \$9.1 million in expenditures.
