#### AUDIT SUMMARY

#### **Results in brief**

In the areas we audited, City operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The City also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

#### About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of College Place from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the City's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Review of credit card expenditures
- Review of general disbursements for allowable uses
- Compliance with procurement of public works projects
- Compliance with architecture and engineering procurement requirements
- Self-insurance for unemployment

#### **INFORMATION ABOUT THE CITY**

The City of College Place is located in Walla Walla County and was incorporated in 1945. The City provides an array of services including police and public safety, general administration, fire protection, parks, water and wastewater, and street services to its approximately 9,000 citizens.

An elected, seven-member Council and an independently elected Mayor govern the City. The Council appoints a City Administrator to oversee the City's daily operations as well as its 30 full-time employees. The City had revenues of \$12,464,612 and expenditures of \$6,682,746 for 2016.
