AUDIT SUMMARY

Results in brief

In the areas we audited, District operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Spokane Valley Fire Department from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2016.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the District's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Self-insurance requirements
- Procurement (bidding/sole source)
- Credit cards
- Contracts/agreements

INFORMATION ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 1, doing business as the Spokane Valley Fire Department, provides fire prevention, suppression and emergency medical services to approximately 125,000 citizens. The District operates 10 fire stations throughout its 75 square-mile service area including the cities of Spokane Valley and Liberty Lake, as well as the town of Millwood and unincorporated areas in Spokane County.

An elected, five-member Board of Commissioners governs the District. The Board appoints a Fire Chief to oversee the District's daily operations as well as its approximately 200 employees. The District operated on actual expenditures of approximately \$31.8 million for 2015 and \$34.3 million for 2016.
