## **AUDIT SUMMARY**

#### Results in brief

In the areas we audited, Authority operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The Authority also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

#### About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Washington Cities Insurance Authority from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Authority's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Compliance with WAC 200-100
- Insurance/risk management

## INFORMATION ABOUT THE AUTHORITY

Washington Cities Insurance Authority was formed to provide member cities, towns and interlocal entities with comprehensive and economical liability coverage. The Authority helps members to reduce the amount and frequency of losses and to decrease the cost incurred in the handling and litigation of claims. Subsequently, the Authority has expanded into a group property insurance program, boiler and machinery, crime and fidelity, and cyber insurance program. The Authority administers a joint protection program through which the members jointly pool and self-insure losses and claims, and jointly purchase excess reinsurance.

A Board of Directors governs the Authority's operations. The Board is composed of one representative from each member city, town and interlocal entity. The Board appoints an Executive Director to oversee the Authority's daily operations as well as its 21 employees. For 2016, the Authority had annual operating expenses of approximately \$21 million.
