AUDIT SUMMARY

Results in brief

In the areas we audited, City operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The City also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of Washougal from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the City's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Utility billings and collection procedures
- Emergency utility assistance payments
- Cash receipting and adjustments
- Disbursements
- Financial condition

- Payroll leave and gross pay
- Procurement public works and engineering services
- Prevailing wages
- Self-insurance unemployment
- Open public meeting minutes

INFORMATION ABOUT THE CITY

The City of Washougal, located in Clark County, was incorporated in 1908 and has approximately 15,466 citizens. The City provides police and fire protection, emergency medical services, water and sewer service, street and parks maintenance, planning, engineering, cemetery services and building permits.

An elected, seven-member Council and a separately elected Mayor govern the City. The Mayor and Council appoint a City Administrator to oversee the City's daily operations as well as its 80 employees. For fiscal year 2016, the City operated on a budget of approximately \$59.8 million.
