### ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Benton County Fire Protection District No. 2 from January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2010.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Cash receipting
- Inter-local agreements
- Open public meetings

- Annual report filings
- Grant compliance
- Procurement

### RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

### ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Benton County Fire Protection District No. 2 was formed in 1949 to provide fire protection services to the citizens of Benton County. The District's service area covers Benton City and the surrounding areas. An elected, three-member Board of Commissioners governs the District. The Board appoints a Fire Chief to oversee the District's daily operations as well as its three employees and several volunteers. For fiscal years 2008, 2009 and 2010, the District operated on annual budgets of \$1,134,408, \$1,151,481 and \$993,139, respectively.
