ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the North Perry Avenue Water District from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Utility billing and cash receipting
- Open public records laws compliance

- Financial condition
- Payroll leave accrual

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

The North Perry Avenue Water District was created in 1942 and serves approximately 7,700 metered connections. The District has 97 miles of water mains, 14 active wells and seven storage reservoirs. The service area extends from the Bremerton city limits in the south to Keyport in the north. The present boundaries are defined by agreements with the city of Bremerton, Silverdale Water District, Kitsap County Public Utility District No. 1 and Aquarius Water District. The District provides water service and meter installations. In addition, the District also charges each customer for street lighting provided by Puget Sound Energy. An elected, three-member Board of Commissioners governs the District. The District has 15 employees and for the years ended 2010 and 2011 operated on budgets of approximately \$2.8 and 2.6 million, respectively.
