

ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the King County Ferry District from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Accounting/financial reporting
- Cash receipting

- Conflict of interest/ethics laws
- Open public meeting minutes

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

The Metropolitan King County Council established the King County Ferry District on April 30, 2007, to provide passenger-only ferry service. It currently operates routes from Vashon Island and West Seattle to downtown Seattle. The King County Council serves as the District's Board of Supervisors. The District contracts out the management of daily operations mainly to the King County Marine Division by inter-local agreement with King County.

Although a component unit of King County, the District has taxing authority. It levies one-third of one cent property tax per \$1,000 assessed value to pay for operations. In addition to the tax levy, the District receives revenue from passenger fares and state grants.
