ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Public Utility District No. 1 of Whatcom County from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2012.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Open Public Meeting Act compliance
- Utility billing and receipting

- Payroll
- General disbursements

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Public Utility District No.1 of Whatcom County was founded in 1937 to provide electric and water utility services to customers in Whatcom County. An elected, three-member Board of Commissioners governs the District. The Board appoints a General Manager who oversees the District's daily operations as well as its 20 employees. For fiscal years 2011 and 2012, the District received operating revenue of approximately \$14.1 million and \$14.6 million, respectively.
