ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Tumwater School District No. 33 from September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- General revenues
- Open Public Meetings Act
- Enrollment
- Transportation
- Small and attractive assets

- Staff mix
- Financial condition
- Associated Student Body
- Imprest funds

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

Description of the District

Tumwater School District No. 33 Thurston County April 30, 2014

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Tumwater School District No. 33 provides educational services to over 6,000 students in Thurston County. The District's main objective is to provide public school services to students in kindergarten through 12th grade. The District has 10 schools: six elementary schools, two middle schools, two high schools, plus one alternative high school. In addition, the District is host and fiscal agent for two regional programs: New Market Skills Center, which provides career and technical education to students in the region, and Tumwater West, which provides instruction to students in the Thurston County Detention Center.

An elected, five-member Board of Directors governs the District. The Board appoints a Superintendent to oversee the District's daily operations as well as its 632 employees. For the 2012-2013 school year, the District operated on an annual general fund budget of \$61 million.

AUDIT HISTORY

We audit the District annually. The 2011 audit contained a finding for a lack of adequate controls over enrollment reporting in its Alternative Learning Experience program Secondary Options. That finding has been resolved. Prior to that audit, the District had been free of findings for the previous six audits. The current audit is free of findings.
