ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Spokane School District No. 81 from September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Cash receipting
- Contracts/agreements
- Insurance/risk management

- Student transportation reporting
- Associated Student Body activities
- Financial condition

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Spokane School District No. 81 serves approximately 28,300 students in kindergarten through 12th grade in Spokane County. The District has 34 elementary schools, six middle schools, six high schools, a vocational skills center and a number of special programs. The District also provides online courses for middle and high school students through Spokane Virtual Learning.

An elected, five-member Board of Directors governs the District. The Board appoints a Superintendent who is responsible for the daily operations as well as its 3,230 employees. For fiscal year 2013, the District operated on an annual general fund budget of approximately \$316 million.
