ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of Bellingham from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the City. We also determined whether the City complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Rental and lease revenue
- Restricted funds
- Safeguarding of assets
- Credit card disbursements

- Bid law
- Utility billing
- Cash receipting
- Permit revenue

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the City's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The City also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE CITY

The City of Bellingham encompasses approximately 28 square miles of Whatcom County and serves approximately 82,000 citizens. The City provides an array of services including water, sewer, police, Municipal Court, fire, emergency medical services, parks and recreation, library, museum, cemetery, golf course, public improvements, planning and economic development. The City contracts out solid waste collection and disposal.

An elected, seven-member Council and a separately elected Mayor govern the City. The Mayor appoints senior management to oversee the City's daily operations as well as its 846 employees. In fiscal year 2013, the City had an operating general fund budget of \$67 million.
