AUDIT SUMMARY

Results in brief

In the areas we audited, District operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Benton County Mosquito Control District from January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2016.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the District's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- General disbursements are supported and for purpose of District
- Asset tracking
- Valid vendor review
- Benefit payments to ensure payments are supported and in accordance with policy
- Overtime payments to ensure payments are supported and approved
- Payroll payments to ensure payments are supported and approved
- Employee reimbursement payments to ensure payments are allowable and supported

INFORMATION ABOUT THE DISTRICT

The Benton County Mosquito Control District was formed in 1957 to provide mosquito control services for most of Benton County and portions of Yakima County.

The District is governed by a seven-member Board of Trustees appointed to represent local governments within the District. The District has three full-time employees and hires additional 20 employees in the summer to perform spraying and other mosquito control measures. Total revenues were approximately \$1,610,145 in 2014, \$1,401,418 in 2015 and \$1,475,050 in 2016.
