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AUDIT RESULTS

Results in brief

This report describes the overall results and conclusions for the areas we examined. In those selected areas, District operations complied, in all material respects, with applicable state laws, regulations, and its own policies, and provided adequate controls over the safeguarding of public resources.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity, policy, internal control, or area. As a result, no information is provided on the areas that were not examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Jefferson Healthcare from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2018.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

This audit was conducted under the authority of RCW 43.09.260, which requires the Office of the State Auditor to examine the financial affairs of all local governments. Our audit involved obtaining evidence about the District's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters. The procedures performed were based on our assessment of risks in the areas we examined.

Based on our risk assessment for the years ended December 31, 2018 and 2017, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. We examined the following areas during this audit period:

- Tracking and monitoring of theft sensitive assets including pharmaceutical inventory
- Cash receipting timeliness and completeness of deposits, voids and adjustments
- Surplus disposition and receipt of sales proceeds
- Open public meetings documentation of minutes and executive sessions
- Procurement public works projects including prevailing wages and retainage requirements
- Payroll gross wages, overtime and bonus payments

INFORMATION ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Jefferson County Public Hospital District No. 2, doing business as Jefferson Healthcare, is the principal provider of health care services for Port Townsend and the surrounding communities of Jefferson County.

The District is a 25-bed critical access hospital. Services offered by its approximate 500 employees include medical, surgical, 24-hour emergency, family birth and nursery care, laboratory, radiology, physical therapy, home health, orthopedic clinic, cardiac rehabilitation, clinic in Port Ludlow, wellness program, and women's services. The District had operating expenses of \$108 million and \$98 million for 2018 and 2017, respectively.
