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AUDIT RESULTS

Results in brief

This report describes the overall results and conclusions for the areas we examined. In those selected areas, Public Charter School operations complied, in all material respects, with applicable state laws, regulations, and its own policies, and provided adequate controls over the safeguarding of public resources.

However, we noted certain matters that we communicated to Public Charter School management and Board of Directors in a letter dated July 28, 2020, related to Inventory. We appreciate the Public Charter School's commitment to resolving those matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity, policy, internal control, or area. As a result, no information is provided on the areas that were not examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Destiny Charter Middle School from September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

This audit was conducted under the authority of RCW 43.09.260, which requires the Office of the State Auditor to examine the financial affairs of all local governments. Our audit involved obtaining evidence about the Public Charter School's use of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters. The procedures performed were based on our assessment of risks in the areas we examined.

Based on our risk assessment for the year ended August 31, 2019, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. We examined the following areas during this audit period:

- Disbursements/Banking Transactions – review support for vendor payments.
- Inventory of Small and Attractive Assets – review of controls and asset tracking systems
- Student enrollment reporting; test eligibility for special education and basic education.
- Student transportation reporting – review support for ridership counts
- Use of restricted funds – Professional Learning Allocation
- Open public meetings – documentation of minutes and executive sessions

INFORMATION ABOUT THE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL

Destiny Charter Middle School, located in Pierce County, provided educational services to approximately 154 students in grades 6-8 during the 2018-2019 school year.

The Public Charter School is a 501c3 nonprofit corporation established under RCW 28A.710.020 and governed by a three to 25 member appointed Board of Directors that establishes policies for the Public Charter School according to the terms of a renewable, five-year charter contract executed under RCW 28A.710.160.

Green Dot Public Schools Washington State is authorized by Washington State Charter School Commission to operate Destiny Charter Middle School by a five-year contract effective August 24, 2016 and terminating August 24, 2021.

The Public Charter School received approximately \$2.2 million in direct state and federal funding for fiscal year 2019. The Public Charter School operated in one building and employed approximately 25 employees.

Green Dot Public Schools Washington State Charter District's Governing Board held an Open Public Meeting on June 6, 2019 and voted to permanently close operations at Destiny Charter Middle School by the end of August 2019.
