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## AUDIT RESULTS

### Results in brief

This report describes the overall results and conclusions for the areas we examined. In those selected areas, Town operations complied, in all material respects, with applicable state laws, regulations, and its own policies, and provided adequate controls over the safeguarding of public resources.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity, policy, internal control, or area. As a result, no information is provided on the areas that were not examined.

### About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the Town of Wilbur from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

This audit was conducted under the authority of RCW 43.09.260, which requires the Office of the State Auditor to examine the financial affairs of all local governments. Our audit involved obtaining evidence about the Town's use of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters. The procedures performed were based on our assessment of risks in the areas we examined.

Based on our risk assessment for the years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. We examined the following areas during this audit period:

- Accounts payable – electronic funds transfers
- Procurement – public works and purchases
- Interfund loans
- Budget compliance

## INFORMATION ABOUT THE TOWN

The Town of Wilbur was incorporated in 1889 and serves approximately 900 citizens in Lincoln County. The Town provides police protection, general administration, fire prevention, street improvement, and parks and recreation. Additional services include a swimming pool, water and sewer utility, and a library.

An elected, five-member Council and an independently elected Mayor govern the Town. The Council appoints management to oversee the Town's daily operations as well as its 11 regular employees. The Town's operating expenditures were \$1.4 million and \$2.2 million in 2018 and 2019, respectively.
