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AUDIT RESULTS

Results in brief

This report describes the overall results and conclusions for the areas we examined. In those selected areas, Charter Public School operations complied, in all material respects, with applicable state laws, regulations, and its own policies, and provided adequate controls over the safeguarding of public resources.

However, we noted certain matters related to fundraising and teacher certification that we communicated to Charter Public School management and the Board of Directors in a letter dated February 1, 2022. We appreciate the Charter Public School's commitment to resolving those matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity, policy, internal control, or area. As a result, no information is provided on the areas that were not examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the PRIDE Prep Schools from September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

This audit was conducted under the authority of RCW 43.09.260, which requires the Office of the Washington State Auditor to examine the financial affairs of all local governments. Our audit involved obtaining evidence about the Charter Public School's use of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters. The procedures performed were based on our assessment of risks in the areas we examined.

Based on our risk assessment for the year ended August 31, 2020, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. We examined the following areas during this audit period:

- Payroll supplemental contracts, instructor certification, compensated absences
- Restricted funds Professional Learning Allocation compliance and support
- Enrollment Running Start and Basic Enrollment Student reporting
- Accounts payable disbursements review processes and test expenditures

- Fundraising activities review expenditures and processes
- Open public meetings documentation of minutes, executive sessions, and expenditure approvals
- Inventory/small and attractive assets review of asset list

Pride Prep Charter School has inadequate internal controls over maintenance of school records to ensure compliance with state laws, charter contract and to safeguard public resources, resulting in altered supporting documentation and unsupported payroll expenditures.				
Background:				
During the course of the audit, we determined records provided by the Superintendent had been altered. These records included payroll documentation for compensated absences. Also, auditors faced restricted or limited access to school staff and source documentation.				
During the audit period of September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2019, the charter public school received state funding totaling approximately \$7 million (\$3 million in the 2017-2018 school year and \$4 million in the 2018-2019 school year).

Corrective Action Taken:				
At the board level, Pride Prep will ensure diligent retention of all required board documentation. Unrestricted access to employees and third-party providers will be provided as requested in future audits.				
Pride Schools will clearly label any future source documents as "Updated" if any changes are made from the original version and communicate this to auditors.				
The PRIDE Prep Board has contracted with a third-party entity (Joule Growth Partners) to provide additional support in reviewing and presenting financial information. Joule Growth Partners has extensive experience in Chief and Director level financial leadership in the charter school sector, including experience in Washington for the duration of the charter sector. Joule will provide both transactional support and present CFO-level summaries to the				
board and administration on a monthly basis.	_

INFORMATION ABOUT THE CHARTER PUBLIC SCHOOL

Pride Prep Charter School, located in Spokane County, provided educational services to approximately 553 students in grades 6-11 during the 2019-2020 school year.

The Charter Public School is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation established under RCW 28A.710.020 and governed by a three- to 15-member appointed Board of Directors, that establishes policies for the Charter Public School according to the terms of a renewable, five-year charter contract executed under RCW 28A.710.160. Pride Prep is authorized by Spokane Public Schools established by a five-year contract effective July 1, 2016 and terminating June 30, 2021. The contract was renewed for a three-year period as of June 23, 2021.

The Charter public school approximately \$6 million in direct state and federal funding for fiscal year 2020. The Charter Public School operates in one building and employs approximately 75 employees.
